- c. Coordinate and conduct Field Epidemiology Training Program for Veterinarians (FETPV) in targeted regions
- d. Coordinate the design and dissemination of training material for Field Epidemiology Training Program for Veterinarians (FETPV) and accessible through FAO web resources.
- e. Coordinate and develop disease surveillance approaches and advice on implementation in developing countries
- f. Coordinate disease intelligence and risk assessment for early warning and disease prevention in developing countries with a focus in Africa and Asia.
- g. Support veterinary epidemiology and laboratory networks functioning in East Africa and South Asia
- h. Organize and conduct training in outbreak field investigation of suspected cases compatible with rinderpest cases and support disease surveillance/reporting in countries;
- i. Develop risk assessment approaches to be used for decision making in the presence of rinderpest suspicions and other animal health threats;
- j. Support disease surveillance activities (including field investigation on suspect cases) and AGAH/GLEWS rumor tracking for suspected rinderpest events and other animal health threats:
- k. Contribute to enhance daily disease tracking activity at the global and regional level in at risk regions;
- 1. Coordinate the support to the development, implementation and linkage of animal health information systems in targeted countries
- m. Coordinate the development of animal databases/information systems to support analysis at national, regional and global levels;
